Insurance carriers require the following types of information, at a minimum, to evaluate environmental risks at each stage of establishing a new operation.

Site Selection	 Phase I environmental site assessment and related due diligence Purchase or lease agreement terms (environmental indemnities, as-is) Mitigation/management plan for recognized conditions Future use/development schematic or plan Neighborhood demographics if no Phase 1
Development/ Construction	 Type of construction Location/geography Site plan Hard costs (construction value) General contractor contract Length of build (start/end dates)
Operation	 Industry/SIC code Building construction/use/contents Anticipated revenue Raw material and product lists, primary end users Delivery systems Neighborhood demographics Parent entity, affiliate, customer, vendor insurance requirements
